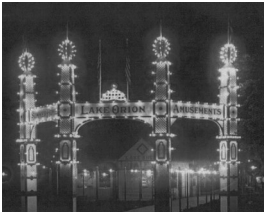

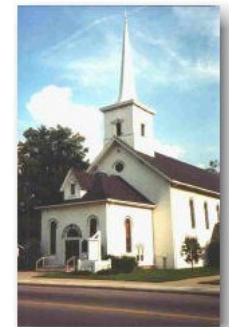
Main Landing Lake Orion

Projects which Orion Historical Society Members have worked on over the past fifteen years:

- ◆ Assisted the Village of Lake Orion with the designation of the Lake Orion Historic District in August of 2006 as a National Register of Historic Places
- ◆ Instigated the Orion Township Reconnaissance Survey for Preservation working with the Orion Township Board of Trustees to allocate funds to do a survey of historic buildings in the township.
- ◆ Assist with an application for the William E. and Nina Downey Scripps home built in 1927 and currently Guest House for its Nation Register of Historic Places.
- ◆ Moving of two historic structures to Orion Township's Friendship Park— The Porritt Barn and Howarth School.
- ◆ Preservation of the Camp Franklin sign in 2004 and placement in the village.
- ◆ Designation of Indian Lake Road Bridge at M24 and Indian Lake Road to National Register of Historic Places in August of 2005.

The members of the Orion Historical Society's mission statement is to involve people to actively participate in the growth and vitality of the Orion community through preservation

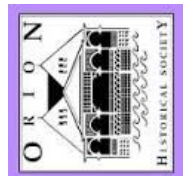
